AKA Documents, Rules & Protocols

1

What do I need to do to reactivate my membership if I've been inactive for one or more years?

Please complete the appropriate form below. Include your current name, address, chapter of initiation and date, last chapter with which you were active, all previous names used and financial card number (if available). Once your membership is reactivated, you will receive a financial card, *Ivy Leaf* magazine and announcements about the Boule, Leadership Seminar, and other events.

To reactivate with a chapter, please complete the **Graduate Chapter Reactivation Form** – complete and submit to the chapter with which you wish to affiliate, plus money order/certified check for reactivation/reinstatement fees, chapter dues, fees and assessments, as applicable.

How much will it cost to reinstate/reactivate my membership?

You will need to pay: reinstatement fees and the Corporate Office Improvement Project (COIP) assessment, if applicable. Corporate assessments include Educational Advancement Foundation (EAF) dues and the cost of the current Constitution and Bylaws and Manual of Standard Procedure.

If you're reactivating with a chapter, you also will need to pay dues and assessments (which vary by chapter).

What is a Transfer Verification Form?

The **Transfer Verification Form** is an official Sorority form which documents that an inactive member has met all financial obligations to her former chapter and the Boule. If you are currently active with a chapter or were last year, you need to request a signed Transfer Verification Form from your chapter. Download a Transfer Verification Form by clicking [here](#).

If you were inactive since before last year and do not owe a debt to a former Chapter, we have implemented an Online Transfer Verification Process (OTVP) that chapters are now using. If the chapter reported that there is not a debt or discrepancy with your record via OTVP, you will be able to reactivate your membership without a physical transfer form. Please use one of the reactivation forms above.

What is the Corporate Office Improvement Project (COIP) assessment?

COIP is a fee that supports an endowment fund, ratified during the 1992 Boule, which pays for building maintenance of the Alpha Kappa Alpha's Corporate Office. Earlier, delegates to the 1990 Boule (Richmond, VA) voted in favor of adding an additional floor and storage space to the Corporate Office building.

The Building and Properties Committee developed a fund-raising plan which included a building assessment fee to pay for this addition. Since January 1, 1994, the one-time COIP assessment must be paid by all financially active members.

Is anyone exempt from the COIP assessment?

Sorors initiated July 31, 1943 and earlier, do not have to pay the COIP assessment.

How do I know or find out if I paid the COIP assessment?

If you were initiated after July 1992, the COIP assessment was included in your initiation fees. If you were initiated before July 1992 or were a Golden Soror as of July 31, 1993 and active after July 1, 1994, contact the Corporate Office (Attention: Membership) if you need to verify payment was made.

PROTOCOL

Protocol for All Sorors

Protocol is the responsibility of all members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. Adherence to protocol enhances the Sorority's operations as well as aids in the creation of a more satisfactory environment. Furthermore, the image of the Sorority in the larger community is greatly enhanced if each member demonstrates a command of protocol.

A. THE ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA PLEDGE

- All sorors should be able to recite the Pledge by memory.
- The Pledge should never be printed on any item.
- When reciting the Pledge, there is no "s" on the word strength.
- The Pledge should not be recited publicly.
- The Pledge should be recited at the beginning or end of chapter meetings.
- When reciting the Pledge after the Hymn, keep arms crossed (right over left) and hands clasped; conclude with a gentle, inconspicuous hand squeeze before releasing hands.

Graduate: Active Chapter Participation Criteria (con't)



- Must be active in chapter for twenty-four (24) consecutive months
- Attend seventy percent (70%) of chapter meetings per year for the past two (2) consecutive years (24 months) of active membership
- Participated in Sorority/Chapter activities by attending at least three (3) of the following activities over the past two (2) years
 - Committee Work; Founders' Day Programs;
 - Program Attendance
 - Connection and Social Justice Events/Legislative Days (i.e. AKA Day at the Capitol)
 - Fundraisers

No other criteria may be included by chapters to determine sponsorship eligibility

International Membership Committee

Note: For the purpose of sponsoring or co-sponsoring a candidate for membership, an active member who has been elected or appointed to a regional or international office, chairmanship, or committee whose absence is because she is busy conducting business on behalf of the organization, shall be exempt from the chapter meeting attendance criteria.

Soror Code of Ethics

SOROR CODE OF ETHICS

In order to honor its Founders, maintain a standard that allows its members to serve as role models for young women and girls in the global community, preserve Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority membership as a desirable and honorable affiliation and to protect Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated from harassment, ridicule, scandal or legal liability, I do voluntarily agree to observe the following rules of conduct:

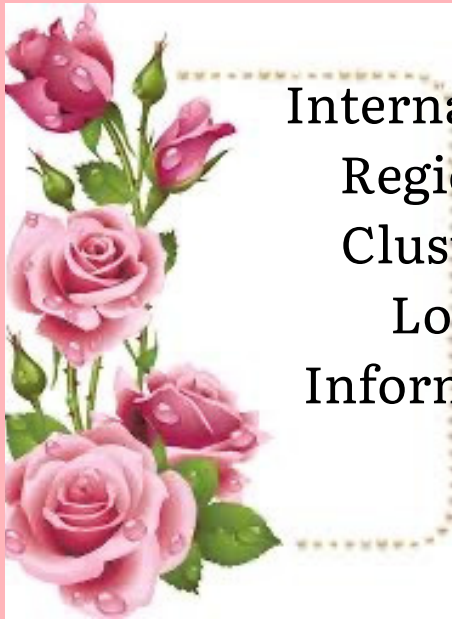
- To respect and comply with the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated Constitution and Bylaws, Manual of Standard Procedure, Protocol Manual, Membership Intake Manual, Rituals, other official handbooks and documents, as well as Chapter Bylaws and Rules of Order.
- To remain subject to the authority of the Broide and the Directorate.
- To respect our elected/appointed leaders and support them in conducting the business of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated.
- To present myself publicly in a way that reflects the high moral and ethical character of Alpha Kappa Alpha women by:
 - Obedying the law.
 - Exercising good manners.
 - Displaying concern for my appearance by following established Alpha Kappa Alpha guidelines.
 - Refraining from profanity, acts of violence and criminal conduct.
 - Exhibiting respect for other Pan-Hellenic organizations by refraining from derogatory remarks or ridiculing them.
 - Wearing identifiable paraphernalia only if conduct or circumstances do not invite negative repercussions to the Sorority.
- To demonstrate the high regard we have for each other as women:
 - Avoiding derogatory, demeaning and insulting remarks.
 - Being polite, kind, honest, fair and conciliatory.
 - Assisting with the special needs of elderly and disabled.
 - Keeping confidences and maintaining confidentiality.
 - Refraining from acts of hating, reporting its occurrence, and demonstrating compliance with all aspect Alpha Sorority, Incorporated Anti-Hazing Policy.
 - Abiding by and actively supporting official Chapter and in the event of personal disagreement.
- To work diligently to foster the programs of the Sorority and part and conference that enhances personal knowledge and improves.
- To maintain integrity in financial matters related to the Sorority by:
 - Remaining current with all dues and financial obligations.
 - Following accepted financial procedures.
 - Avoiding the co-mingling of personal and Sorority funds.
 - Utilizing the tax-exempt status only as legally permitted.
- Expecting that financial officers will maintain records, make them available for inspection and pass them on to succeeding officers and/or Graduate members as required.
- Purchasing only from officially sanctioned vendors at Regional Conferences and Boules.
- Reporting the misappropriation of Chapter funds and/or property to the appropriate authority and taking the necessary action to protect or retrieve funds and/or property belonging to the Sorority.
- To invite for Sorority membership only those community minded women of high moral and ethical character and scholarship who have a true interest in Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority.
- To refrain from soliciting advertisements, endorsements, and sponsorships that bring negative image of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority or that conflict with its program concerns and values.

I shall remain cognizant that others will judge the values and principles of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority by my personal deportment and conduct. Furthermore, should I attain a leadership position in Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, that requires me to be an official spokesman or public representative, I understand that my conduct must rise to the highest standard. Should my behavior compromise Alpha Kappa Alpha's image or the reputation of its members, I shall relinquish my position either of my own volition or when instructed to do so by my Chapter or the Directorate.

In promising to obey these rules of conduct, I acknowledge that the perpetuation of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, as an organization of women of high moral and ethical standards depends on my compliance.

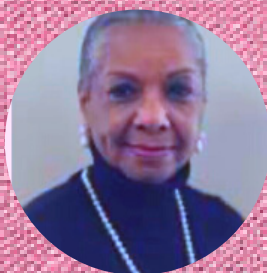

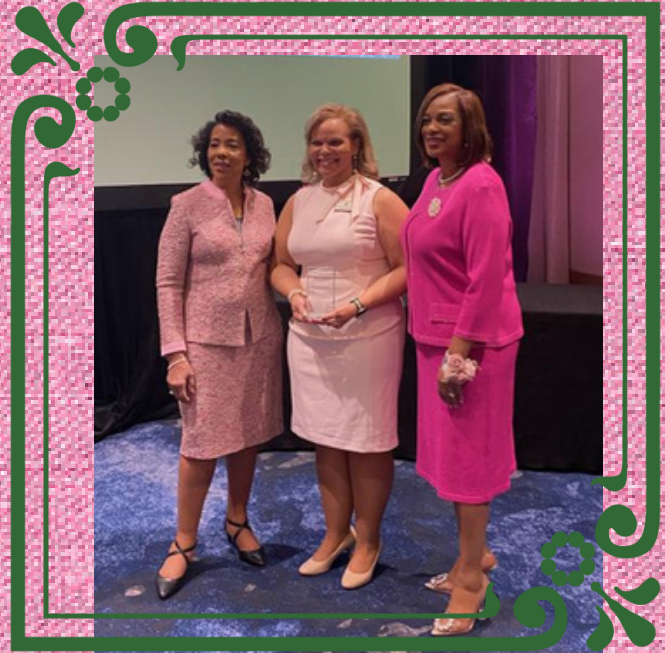

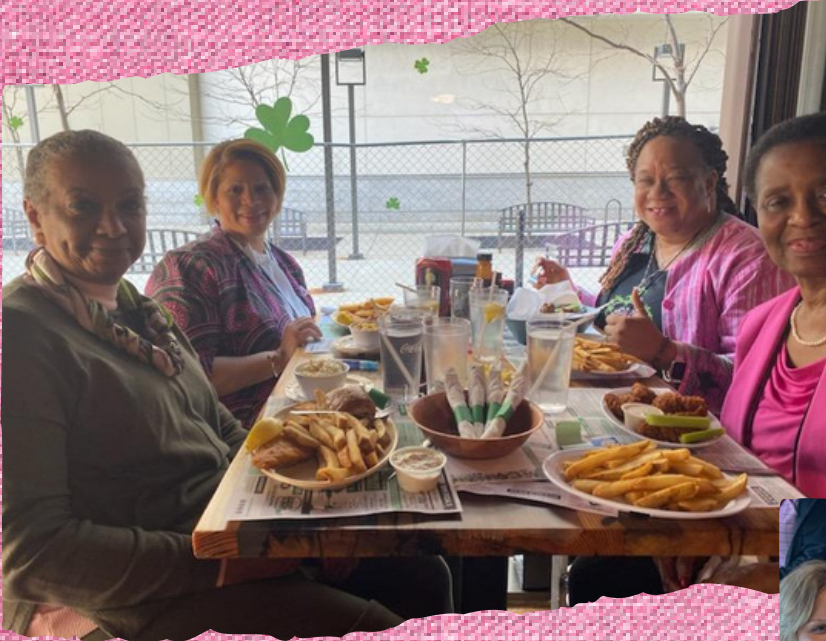
